"Your Sins are Forgiven"

Luke 7:36—8:3

Leah pulled the stopper from her bottle of perfume and poured the sweet oil onto Jesus' feet. The room was quickly filled with the pleasant aroma. The Pharisee, Simon, sniffed the air and looked disapprovingly at Leah, kneeling behind Jesus.

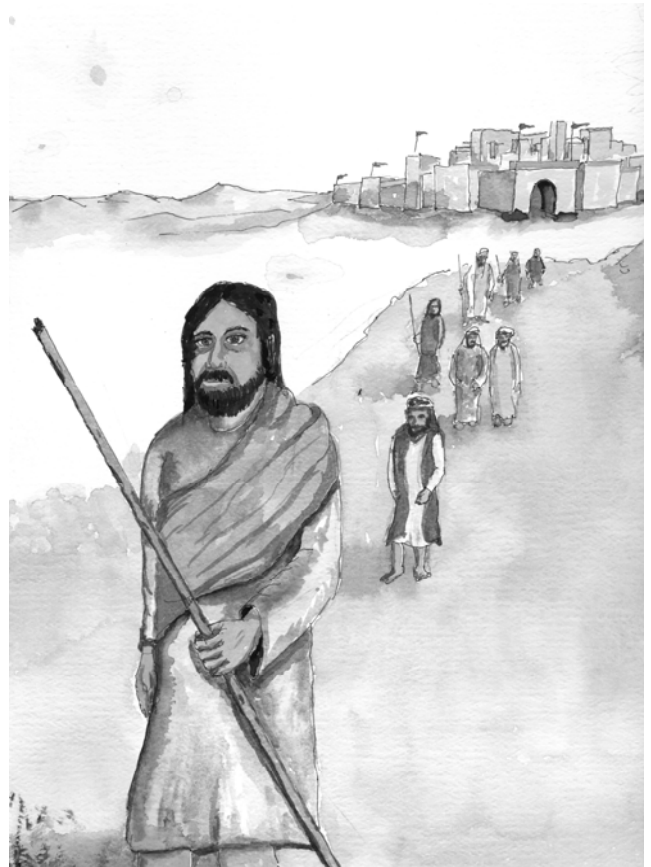
As Simon's dinner guest, Jesus was reclining on the low couch, propped up on one elbow. His feet hung over the edge of the couch and the woman, Leah, crying for her sins, was washing Jesus' feet with her tears. The scent of the oil and the presence of Jesus overwhelmed Leah and she began to cry all the more, bowing lower.

Simon watched as her wet tears sprinkled droplets onto Jesus' glossy feet. Offended by her presence in his house, Simon began to doubt that Jesus was a real prophet. If he were, he would know this sinful woman for what she was.

Jesus suddenly looked directly at Simon, startling him as if he had heard the things Simon was thinking..

"Simon, I have something to propose to you," Jesus said. The priest braced himself for what his "prophet" guest would say to him. Jesus told a story about gratitude in which a man with a large debt was told he did not have to repay it. Another man with only a small debt was forgiven too. Jesus asked Simon who would be more grateful, the man with the large debt or the one with the small debt. Simon agreed it would be the one with the large debt.

"See this woman?" Jesus asked, pointing to Leah who was gently drying Jesus' feet with her long black hair. "I came to your home and you provided me no water for my feet. She has washed my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. You gave me no kiss, but she has not ceased kissing my feet since I entered. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with perfume. I tell you that is why her many sins are forgiven—because of her great love."



Leah had backed away and was listening to Jesus' words of praise. She was no longer crying and hope was on her face. Jesus turned to her and said, "Your sins are forgiven. Your faith has been your salvation. Go now in peace."



It may be difficult to imagine ourselves as the ones whose tears wash the feet of Jesus. Perhaps we perceive our sins as small and therefore we can't be expected to be as grateful as the woman with great sins. As we grow richer in faith there is the even greater temptation for us to judge ourselves as worthy—maybe even too worthy to wash Jesus' feet. Our dry tear ducts may be the subtle sin. The story challenges us to get our perceptions straightened out. To know that every breath is a gift. To know that our little time of life is short and that we should make haste to pour out the perfume of our love on the feet of Jesus walking in our midst.
