JUNE 20, 2010 – 12TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

"The Road South" . . .

Luke 9:18-24

Long red streamers floated from the flagpoles atop the towers on the walls of the northern city of Caesarea Philippi. The light breeze lifted the Roman streamers which proclaimed this place was ruled under the Tetrarchy of Philip. Guards on the parapets surveyed the road to the north. It was filled with travelers heading for Damascus through the scorched sands of Syria. To the east was Mount Hermon from which waters flowed south to Lake Huleh. From Caesarea it was a long 30 mile walk to the Sea of Galilee.

In a grove of trees along that south road Jesus prayed alone. He sat with hands folded in his lap, lost in prayer as he stared aimlessly at his dusty, sandaled feet. He knew he was beginning a final journey to Jerusalem. From now on the direction would only be south.

Despite all that he had tried to preach and teach Jesus wondered if anyone really understood. He also wondered what his closest followers really thought. Hearing the disciples approaching from behind him, Jesus turned and tossed them his question: "Who do the crowds say that I am?"

James Alphaesis said: "Some say you are John the Baptist."

Simon, the zealot, responded. "I've heard them say you are Elijah, or one of the prophets from long ago, come back to life."

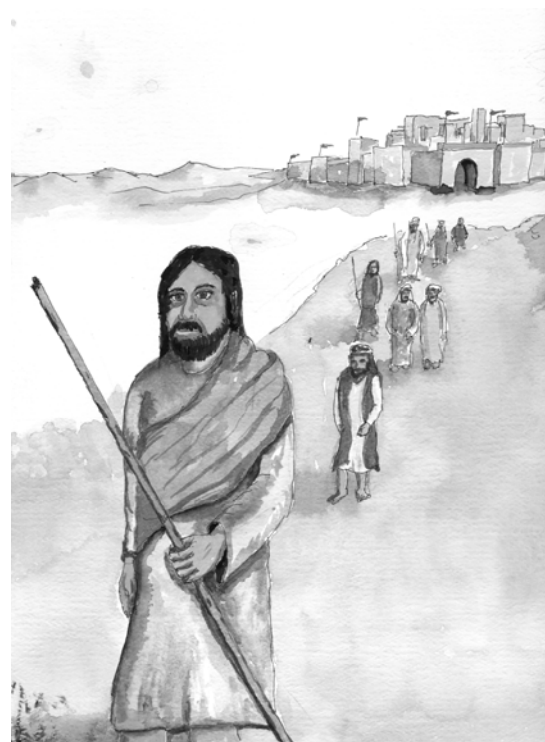
Jesus face grew stern. "And who do YOU say that I am?" He asked them, looking each in the eye and ending with Peter who tried to avoid the question by looking down.

"What about you, who do you say that I am," Jesus repeated.

Peter looked up, his face full of resolve: "You are God's Messiah," he announced.

Jesus face brightened with Peter's declaration. It was a much-needed and reassuring affirmation. Jesus rose to his feet and took the first step south, leading his flock back toward Galilee.

As they walked along the way, Jesus said to the Disciples: "If you want to come with me you



must take up your cross every day and follow me.” He let them think about that for a while.

Jesus was thinking about the danger that awaited him in Jerusalem. To strengthen and reassure them, Jesus added: “Whoever wants to save his own life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it.”



Back in school there were lots of things we had to learn. A common question to the instructor was “Are these questions going to be on the test?”

Jesus asks us some difficult question today. They are definitely on the test!

Who do we say that Jesus is?

Do we really know him?

Is he at the center of our life?

A good test to whatever our answers may be is the next question he put to the disciples. Are we willing to take up our cross each day in order to follow him? Are we willing to lose our life for his sake in order to save our life?

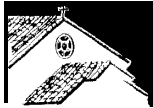
