### *Lessons in Discipleship*

*Luke 10:25-37*

From the cool shade of the temple building the crowd watched the young lawyer stride confidently toward them. As he crossed the open courtyard, the sunlight brightened the colors of the expensive robes that flew about him. Reaching the shade, the lawyer's eyes narrowed searching out Jesus who was sitting among the others. One by one conversations stopped and everyone fell silent.

They already knew this man who had come to test Jesus. He had previously come to pose his questions. All were eager to hear the debate and the battle of wits that was sure to come.

Jesus nodded to the lawyer, inviting him to deliver his newest question.

"Rabbi," he said, honoring Jesus with the title, "what must I do to inherit everlasting life?" It was a common theological question among the Jews.

Jesus replied, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?"

His counter question neatly avoided any trap and invited the lawyer to demonstrate his own knowledge of the law. Jesus waited for the debater to explain his own opinion of what the law meant.

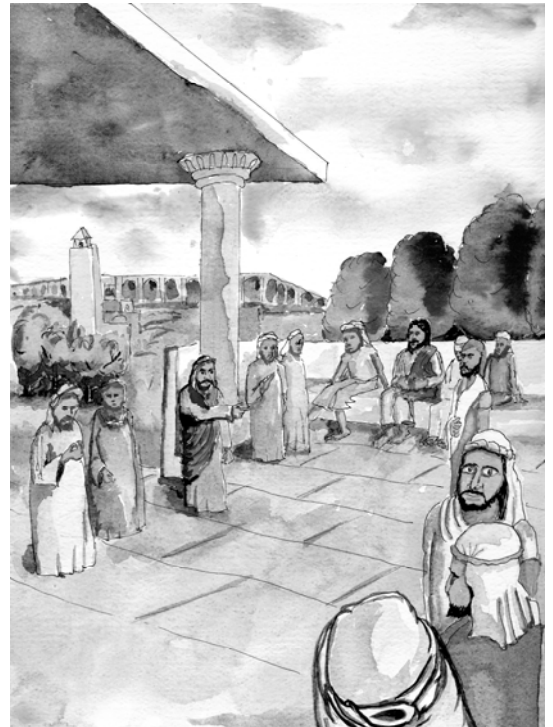
The young lawyer impressed everyone by quickly coming up with quotations which he knew from the scrolls of Deuteronomy and Leviticus: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

Jesus praised him. "You have answered correctly. Do this and you shall live."

Not satisfied, the lawyer pressed on. "And who is my neighbor?"

Jesus began, telling a story about a man who was robbed and beaten. The first to find him was a priest who discovered him, bloodied and motionless by the roadside. Thinking him dead, the priest passed him by.

At this there was a murmur of talk from the crowd as they recalled that the priest could not risk defiling himself by touching the dead—even by letting his shadow fall upon the corpse.



“Likewise,” Jesus continued, “there was a Levite...” The crowd joining in the juicy debate began to argue that even these Levite temple workers had to be cautious. The rules for them were less strict than for priests, but they too needed to avoid such defilement.

Jesus’ story led them to next imagine the loathsome Samaritan coming upon the man who was beaten. This foreigner was full of compassion and helped the injured man in every way.

“Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the man who fell in with the robbers?” Jesus asked of the lawyer. The choice pitted the good and proper priest and Levite against the lowly and despised Samaritan man.

Not even wanting to say the word Samaritan, the lawyer submitted: “The one who showed compassion.”

“Then go and do the same.” Jesus said with authority.



*As “priests and Levites” have we walked by someone in need today? In our family are there those who have been “robbed and beaten” and left needing our help? In our parish community there are those who call out to us from the “roadside,” seeking our help with the many projects and needs in our church. The world calls out to us as well. Most of us have mailboxes filled with invitations to be a good neighbor!*

*Did we help or did we “walk on by”? The young lawyer’s original question was “What must I do to inherit everlasting life?” Clearly the answer is not to “walk on by” but rather to learn this valuable lesson in discipleship.*

Phase IV, the final phase, will be windows in the Chapel, but this will not be done until Phase III closes out and once Church Renovation Funds accumulate to the point where a complete structural remodel of the Chapel can be undertaken.
